

## **CHAPTER 4 - REGIONS**

### **4.1 Boundaries of Regions**

For the purpose of administration and representation, the Local Chapters in the Corporation shall be classified into Regions. The Regional levels shall be an integral part of the Corporation and shall be responsible to the National Board and General Assembly for their actions. The Regions may be made up and shown as follows:

*The British Columbia and Yukon Region*

The Province of British Columbia and the Yukon Territories.

*The Western Region*

The Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan and the Northwest Territories.

*The Mid-Canada Region*

The Province of Manitoba and the Territory of Nunavut.

*The Ontario Region*

The Province of Ontario.

*The Quebec Region*

The Province of Quebec.

*The Atlantic Region*

The Provinces of New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland and Labrador.

The boundaries above are general guidelines only and may be varied by the National Board, provided that the consent of the Local Chapter and Regions affected is first obtained.

The Regions shall be administered according to the Constitution, By-laws and Policies of A.I.M. CAN.

### **4.2 Assignment of Local Chapters to Regions**

Each Local Chapter geographically located entirely within one (1) of the Regions specified in By-law 4.1 shall be assigned to that Region. The National Board shall have the prerogative to assign to a Region any Local Chapter which is not geographically located entirely within one (1) of the Regions specified in By-law 4.1.

### **4.3 Regional Presidents**

Each Regional President shall be responsible for supervising and co-ordinating the activities of the Local Chapters so assigned within the limits of the authority given by these By-laws.

#### **4.4 Regional Wind-up**

Notwithstanding By-laws 4.1 to 4.3 the National Board shall have no right to dissolve a Regional Corporation, Foundation or Society, or claim the assets of such organization except as it relates to the protection of the Corporation's copyrights or trademarks with the approval of the National Board.
